

## OUTREACH COMMITTEE REPORT TO SESSION January 2020

Three requests for help with rent were received.

### A Place to Sleep

- 295 children received beds in 2019 and 6 have received beds in 2020 making a total of 2027 children having received beds with 31 on the waiting list.
- Christ Community Church has agreed to continue to deliver beds on the 4th Sunday of each month.
- Donations of hospital blankets and baby blankets were received.

#### Give a Kid a Brighter Day

-Cadence provided 70 gift bags with pajamas, a book, and a toy for children in the families of our Christmas boxes.

#### Serenity Center

- -This church is volunteering at the Serenity Center on 7<sup>th</sup> Street the first Wednesday of each month.
- -Musical Instrument Ministry: 115 instruments have been placed in the schools to date.
- -God's Kitchen remains closed.
- -The Parks Department is collecting plastic bottle caps for four benches for the new Greenway Trail. Take the caps to the FAC.
- -The Mitten Tree will remain up until the gloves are no longer needed.
- -The Super Bowl Challenge is on! We are collecting items for the veterans.
- -Christmas boxes were assembled and delivered on December 21. The food, clothing, and toys which the congregation donated allowed those who picked up their boxes to have extra. In addition, we were able to provide boxes to four additional families making a total of 54 food boxes this year. We appreciate and thank everyone who donated money or food, prayed, and helped to assemble and deliver the boxes. Way to go 1<sup>st</sup> Presbyterians!!
- -Thanks to everyone who participated in ringing the Salvation Army bells. All slots were filled, and we helped many people.
- -The next meeting will be February 9, 2020 at 9:00.



"As many of you know, I am entering my first semester of nursing school this spring with the expectation of having RN BSN follow my name by December 2021. I'm sharing this because you've played a role in my life and/or educational

journey in some way thus far. I have been faced with an amazing opportunity this summer. It is the opportunity to earn 6 practicum credit hours while in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. I will earn these hours working in a clinic for individuals diagnosed with HIV, volunteering at an orphanage, and gaining hands-on experience with labor and delivery. I'm most excited to work with the new mothers during delivery. I'll get to experience delivering a baby independently, an opportunity that only doctors get here in the United States. This trip has been a dream of mine since I heard about it my Freshman year of college. The cost of the trip is \$4,975 plus airfare, with airfare being an estimated \$1,500. I have already been accepted into this program which is a huge accomplishment due to its very competitive application process. This trip will not only be an amazing experience for me, but it will also help me in the future as it will set me apart from other applicants in the workforce and when applying for practitioner school. I am writing you this not only to inform you about the journey I'm about to partake in, Lord willing, but also to ask for any monetary assistance you feel led to give. As you can tell from the cost I stated earlier, this is not a cheap venture. When it comes to this trip, finances are something that I've had to put in the Lord's hands. The scholarships I've earned in order to attend college do not apply towards this trip; therefore, it's on me to raise money for my education in a different way than I have in the past. I believe I am supposed to go on this trip, and I know the Lord will provide. If you are so moved, I am asking you to please donate however much you can. If you are not able to financially give, I ask you to share this with your business and/or other friends who may be able to help. I am also asking for prayers leading up to my trip that the Lord will be able to provide financially, for God to grant me wisdom, and of course, prayers during my trip for safety and good health.




